McGill Education and Outreach Symposium November 24^{th-}25th, 2016

Context

We are organising this symposium to help initiate a research program on the effects of dental school community outreach/service programs. The rationale for this symposium is twofold. First, significant problems of access to dental care exist for vulnerable groups living in Canada (http://cahs-acss.ca/improving-access-to-oral-health-care-for-vulnerable-people-living-in-canada/), and second, all Canadian dental schools are involved in numerous activities providing care while teaching dental students to work with such groups. Despite dental schools' commitment of resources to these activities, few investigations on their benefits regarding patient or learner outcomes have been conducted. Furthermore, these initiatives have little effect on the broader issue of access to dental care, in terms of the development of new, sustainable models of dental care delivery that can be adopted beyond the scope of dental school activities.

Given this context, the goals of this workshop are to:

- 1. Provide participants with the findings of relevant scientific literature and a survey of the community activities being performed by Canadian dental schools.
- 2. Identify the philosophical underpinnings of dental care outreach activities conducted in Canadian schools.
- 3. Identify what elements (stakeholders and evaluation themes) of Canadian dental school outreach activities can be evaluated and how.
- 4. Develop a plan of action at a Canadian level focusing on dental education and research.
