The 2021/2022 Department of Dentistry Student Research Group had the unique experience of planning for and executing a year of hybrid programming as the University of Alberta campus responded to the ongoing COVID-19 health crisis. Our goals this year were to make the return to in-person programming as smooth as possible for students doing research, while providing long-absent opportunities for live presentations and mixing with other students. This physical return to campus began in the fall, but was redirected online with fluctuating pandemic-related safety measures. By April of 2022, the committee had returned to physical meetings and we shifted to a more permanent on-campus presence.

This year, the Student Research Group hosted the first student-organized Day of Dentistry poster session on campus. For many students, this was their first opportunity to share their research performed at the School of Dentistry. For some, it was the first live presentation of their careers. This event was a great success, and paved the way for our next live event welcoming Dr. Antonio Nanci to the University of Alberta to present the annual prestigious Geoffrey H. Sperber lecture. The SRGEC also took this opportunity to organize a student networking luncheon with Dr. Nanci, forging career-long connections in a welcoming trainee environment. The simultaneous ACFD meeting enabled the University of Alberta SRGEC to connect with students from McGill University seeking guidance on establishing their own local SRG. As a result, our remaining virtual Career Mentorship events were well attended by McGill University trainees as well as our local School of Dentistry students. This partnership foreshadows a promising avenue for School of Dentistry trainee outreach in years to come.

This year's programming aimed to serve all pillars of student research in the department, though undergraduate students were less well represented in attendance than usual. Our recommendation to the 2022/23 SRGEC is to prioritize outreach to clinical undergraduate and graduate students, as well as continuing our efforts to rebuild the research community after several years of social flux. This year's on-campus committee, elected on September 26<sup>th</sup>, will be well positioned to continue the SRG's legacy of student fellowship and research support.
