In the academic year 2022/2023, the Department of Dentistry Student Research Group seized a remarkable opportunity to lead the way in the first year of post-pandemic recovery. This allowed us to conduct most of our meetings and events in person. As a result, a substantial surge in attendance and heightened interactions between students and faculty members.

Throughout this year, our objective was to cultivate a culture of research among undergraduate students. To achieve this, we organized a series of in-person events, including the Fall and Winter Research Mixers, that offered an excellent platform for students to engage with their peers and faculty members, which witnessed remarkable attendance and provided a conducive environment for interaction. Supervisors presented their projects during these mixers, allowing students to engage in research discussions with faculty members. We also held an event for summer research students at the beginning of summer to welcome them to the program.

Furthermore, we achieved a significant accomplishment by successfully hosting the second annual student-organized Day of Dentistry Poster Session. This event was important for numerous students as it marked their first chance to present their research projects at the School of Dentistry. A dedicated session on poster preparation was held before the main event to assist students in creating effective posters, offering them valuable guidance on preparing and presenting their research.

This year, we undertook a novel initiative by organizing a two-day Research Day event for the first time, aligning it with the Geoffrey H. Sperber lecture series. Despite the initial concerns and challenges in planning the events due to the high number of presentations, both events yielded positive outcomes. Importantly, students and faculty members expressed contentment with the outcomes and the great lessons learned through the experience.

Building upon the insights provided by the preceding SRG, our efforts were directed toward enhancing engagement with undergraduate students, resulting in their active participation in the events. Nonetheless, there remains a persistent concern surrounding the limited presence of faculty members and students, particularly during the Research Day event. This issue merits the attention of the forthcoming SRG. Benefiting from an increased budget this year, we successfully incentivized attendance by providing refreshments and lunch during our meetings.

The selection process for the following year's SRG should commence earlier, and strategic promotion of the SRG during the DDS student orientation should be considered.

			Due to the low attendance for last year's session, hosting it before an in-person session, like the Day of Dentistry poster session, was suggested. The attendance was still pretty low, with six attendees. However, after the session, the presentation was shared with all students which was helpful to prepare their posters for the upcoming poster session.			
March 30, 2023	Day of Dentistry Poster Session	\$180	A live poster session was held at Glacier Room - Lister Centre for all students conducting research in the School of Dentistry. A requirement for Summer Researchers to present their research. SRG administered awards judged by faculty and post-doctoral fellows.			
			This event was organized for the second time by the SRG. Organization and execution ran smoothly, and many students and faculty complimented the event.			
			Suggestion: The main suggestions for improving this event include booking a larger presentation room and increasing presentation time. A detailed list of recommendations is available in the SRG drive.			
March 30, 2023	Student Networking event with Dr. Sreenath Madathil	\$65.7	It was an in-person meeting held at 5-099. Interested students had a chance to network with the keynote speaker of the day of dentistry, Dr. Madathil, a faculty			

			member at McGill University. It was a well-attended session, and students shared their research with the speaker and learned about his research.
June 13, 2023	Geoffrey H. Sperber lecture (Dr. Bernhard Ganss)	\$0 (Departme nt expense)	Prestigious craniofacial seminar series honoring Dr. G.H. Sperber, presented by Dr. Bernhard Ganss, Professor at the University of Toronto at the University of Alberta. The Student Research Group supplied refreshments. Dr. Ganss's schedule for meetings was designed by the SRG and SOD research coordinator, and he was escorted to all engagements by students or faculty. Dr. Ganss met with faculties and visited the Dentistry Museum at the University of Alberta.
June 13, 2023	Student Networking event with Dr. Bernhard Ganss	\$268.01	The Student Research Group provided lunch for trainees interested in visiting with Dr. Ganss during his Sperber Lecture visit
June 13 and 14, 2023	Graduate Student Research Day	\$498.77 (Catering: \$298.77; Prizes: \$200)	First and Second-year graduate students were required to present their work to faculty and trainees. Faculty members gave talks feedback, and awards were given for the highest scores. While organizing this event with more than 30 presentations aligned with the Sperber lecture was challenging, it was well organized, and refreshments were provided during the event. Most students could present their work, though some were working remotely away from Alberta. Despite reserving this date in advance, many students left after their presentations. Not well attended by faculty who were not invited to judge presentations. Suggestions: The main suggestions for this event were planning and booking the calendar well and encouraging the faculty and students to attend the events.
